are facing two confronting mechanisms, the notions of globalization and regionalization. He said that regional trade provides the countries opportunities to cope with the fierce global competitiveness. "The regional countries could build their muscles together to battle globalization" he added. He said that we have failed to make any significant progress in intra-regional trade and it remains much low though we have a remarkable intra-regional trade potential. He emphasized over bringing the people of region together through dialogue and peace to create a regional competiveness, and to bring together the nations to strive poverty and disease as we are one most poverty inflicted region. He mentioned that the region is still lagging behind in terms of Human Development, he stressed upon ensuring trickle-down effect of economic growth.

"About 80 percent of the South Asia are India and Pakistan, they can trigger the regional trade and businesses" Mr. Igbal said. He said that we need to overcome the challenges to reap common benefits. He opined that people of the region could be brought near for people to people cooperation through a liberal visa regime. He mentioned that lack of trust and confidence over each other make the businesses and businessmen suffer. "We need to make efforts to bridge the gap of trust by dialogue". "We need to embrace the openness of economies by hearts and minds" he added. He said that now is the time for action, every second we waste will be a crime against people of South Asia, we need to move with great speed and pace, else we would be left behind.

Mr. Kunwar Qutubuddin Khan GA Member SAARC CCI offered vote of thanks and appreciated presence of Federal Ministers in the occasion and regarded it as proof of political will of the government. An MoU was signed between SAARC Chamber of Commerce and Industries and AHAN. The participant also cut a cake to mark the occasion of 28th SAARC Charter day.

The seminar brought together representatives from Public and Private Sector, diplomatic corps, CSOs, NGOs and various walks of life.


